
BRETT'S COMMENTS



Dear Parents and Guardians,

Nuwilim (Welcome) to the 2019-2020 school year! Last year Learning Alternatives students, staff and families had more success than ever before. We had a record number of graduates, won the Skills Canada Bridge Building Competition, sent students to provincial championships for athletics, built Learning Studio 2.0 and had two staff named finalists for the Premier's Awards for Excellence in Education. This year we are excited to celebrate even more success!

We will continue to use the Circle of Courage model to help guide the learning we lead. This model proposes that belonging, mastery, independence and generosity are the central values – the unifying theme – of positive cultures for education and youth work programs. We believe the philosophy embodied in the circle of courage is cultural birthright for all the world's children.



The month of September is when we put a strong emphasis on the sense of belonging. This year we are learning about how we are all related and how one's actions impinge on the natural environment. Maintaining balanced ecological relationships is a way of ensuring balance in one's own life.

During September, we will also make sure that every student is enrolled in courses required to help them on their graduation path. Each student is connected to a cohort teacher. The cohort teacher will be the best point of contact for progress reports, attendance, graduation planning and any other questions that parents/guardians may have. FROM THE MATH CORNER

We are again offering Math Pre-Calculus 11 & 12 this year. A clear student commitment and no quitting attitude are needed to be successful in these courses! Any gaps in student's math background will be addressed as needed.

Pre-Calculus 11

The concepts covered include powers, rational operations & expressions, radical/quadratic/linear-operations and equations, factoring, inequalities, trigonometry (non-right triangles) and angles in standard position, compound interest, investments and loans.

Pre-Calculus 12

This is a must have course for University Math and Science programs. The concepts covered include transformations, exponential, logarithmic, and polynomial functions & equations, trigonometric functions, equations and identities, rational functions and geometric sequences & series.
